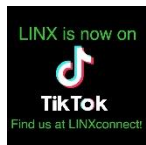
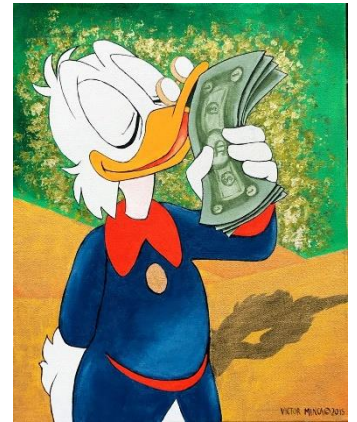
What has LINX been up to the month of February?

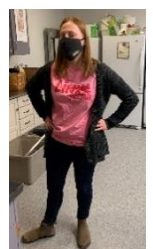


Connections – Our Client's have walked around the World!
